EAST AFRICA - KENYA EXPEDITION

The Kenya expedition is a service based program in which students will travel and partner with Camps International and local villages to support education and community projects.

Students will contribute to a range of projects helping support education and community development in two rural communities. They will live and work alongside local peoples, learning about the challenges they face as well as the rich traditions and culture of Kenya, as well as experience truly incredible wildlife up close on safari.



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SAMPLE PROGRAM

Activity	Description
Community Service Projects	 Students participate in project work including: Improving infrastructure at a local school/s Wildlife conservation project work. Work with local people to help make elephant deterrent fences (the method regarded by locals as the best way to deter elephants from their farms without harming the animals). Participate in an educational environmental workshop, making paper out of elephant dung to bring a source of income to the local community. Spending time with an inspiring women's group who we have been working with for many years. You will learn about the challenges faced by women in rural communities and the innovative projects we are supporting to aid income generation. You'll get to try your hand at some of these projects too, learning to make bead crafts that can be sold. Muhaka village remains one of the poorest communities in the local area and many of its residents cannot afford to repair or rebuild their houses, which have deteriorated over time. The school is also in need of improvements and repairs. You will help by building traditional housing for people and supporting the ongoing renovation of the school. Visit the sacred Kaya forest and work on clearing a buffer zone for indigenous tree planting and building a sheltered tree nursery. Beach clean up at Diani and learn how to turn discarded flip flops into other products at a Marine Conservation workshop.
Cultural immersion and sightseeing	 Visit the world-famous Maasai tribe, learning about their unique culture and traditions. An unforgettable safari at Tsavo East National Park, one of Kenya's top wildlife destinations. Keep your eyes peeled and you may be able to spot a variety of wildlife including elephants, lions, giraffes and zebras. Relax on the beach at Diani

TRAVEL

Students will fly Economy Class travel to Mombassa via Dubai. Travel in Kenya is via bus and 4WD.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

Students will be supervised by Inaburra staff as well as an Australian Camps International leader as well as local Camps International guides. Students will be expected to adhere to the school code of conduct at all times. Camps International have qualified and experienced expedition leaders, supported on the ground by our permanently employed local Camps staff. We have resident British directors in every region, a head office in each destination country and a year-round operation. As a Camps International traveller, you stay in the camps that we own, you use our transport, you work on our projects and are supported by our staff.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS AND TEACHER/STUDENT RATIOS

The program has a target minimum 15 students with an approximate teacher/student ratio of 1:7.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation will be in dormitory style camps in villages (traditional Bandas), with basic shower and toilet amenities.

COST AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

The cost of the Camps International Kenya Expedition program is estimated to be \$6750. The final cost may change due to fluctuations in airfare price at time of final booking.

The amount will be communicated at a later date and will cover:

- All transport including flights and transfers.
- All accommodation
- All meals (3 healthy meals a day + snacks)
- 1 qualified Camps International guide
- Travel Insurance

Inaburra and Camps International require this program to be paid in instalments. Instalment amounts and due dates will be outlined in detail, along with other key information about the program, once itineraries and total costs are determined.
