INABURRAYEAR10 GLOBALEDUCATION PROGRAM

TASMANIA

The Tasmania Global Education program has been designed with the environmental aspects of ‘global’ education in mind.

Students will explore the diverse landscapes of Tasmania and will have opportunities to help conserve environmental and historical sites through potential activities such as fuel load reduction, weed eradication, planting and coastal protection.

SAMPLE PROGRAM

Activity	Description
Conservation Activities	As above, students will assist in the conservation activities such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fuel load reduction • Weed eradication • Planting and regeneration
Outdoor Activities	Students may have opportunity to experience outdoor activities including short hikes, kayaking and mountain bike tours.
Historical and Geographical sites	Students visit and explore sites other than those where practical help will be offered. Students may have opportunities to visit locations around the entire state, including Maria Island (see below), Port Arthur, Queenstown, areas of the Tarkine, Cradle Mountain, Strachan, the Gordon-Franklin river and Sarah Island.
Maria Island	Students stay overnight on Maria Island. Since the late 1960s Maria has become a kind of Noah's Ark, as a number of threatened species have been introduced here in a bid to protect their kind. The very things that made the island a convict settlement, now make it an ideal refuge for plant and animal species that are elsewhere under threat.

TRAVEL

The airline for travel ex Sydney is still to be determined. In previous years it has been Virgin Australia. Travel within Tasmania will be by chartered coach and boat. Students will travel to and from Maria Island by ferry.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

Students will be supervised by Inaburra staff. Students will be expected to adhere to the school code of conduct at all times and will be briefed on particular aspects of safety in preparation for the program and will also have an orientation session upon arrival in Tasmania.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS AND TEACHER/STUDENT RATIOS

This program has a target maximum of 30 students due to a number of external factors. There will be an approximate teacher/student ratio of 1:8.

ACCOMMODATION

Students will stay in bunk/dormitory accommodation with shared bathroom facilities

COST AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

The cost of the Tasmania Global Education program is estimated to be \$2600. The final cost of the program is dependent on several variables including (but not limited to) student numbers and seasonal price variation. This amount will be communicated at a later date and will cover:

- All transport – flights, transfers and ferries
- All accommodation
- All meals
- Park entry fees
- Conservation activities and equipment (excluding clothing)
- Travel insurance

NOTE: Students are encouraged to bring some spending money as opportunities for private purchases may arise.

It would also be expected that students take appropriate clothing for outdoor work (for example, gardening gloves, sturdy footwear, and appropriate sun protection). Inaburra requires this program to be paid in instalments. Instalment amounts and due dates will be outlined in detail, along with other key information about the program, once itineraries and total costs are determined.

Please be aware that due to the nature of travel and accommodation, payment deadlines for this program will be very tight and must be adhered to strictly.
