SAMPLE PROGRAM

ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
Community Service	Students will participate in community service and learning with organisations and individuals in Broken Hill and Menindee including Land regeneration and local church ministries.
Indigenous Culture	Students will participate in educational sessions on local Aboriginal culture and ministries. They will have opportunities to serve Indigenous communities through local ministries and other practical community service initiatives including building and garden maintenance programs.
Broken Hill Exploration	Students have the opportunity to visit a number of significant historical and cultural sites in and around Broken Hill including the Line of Lode, Silverton, the Royal Flying Doctor Service Broken Hill base, Pro Hart Gallery, Menindee Lakes and Mutawintji National Park.

TRAVEL

Travel to Broken Hill from Sydney is via NSW Trainlink. Return travel is Coach to Adelaide and return flight to Sydney (either Jetstar or Virgin Australia). The mode of travel in and around Broken Hill is dependent on final student numbers, but is likely to be a combination of chartered coach and hired mini buses. Travel costs are incorporated in the final price of the program and will be determined when student numbers and itineraries are finalised.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

Students will be supervised by teachers in the program. Students will be expected to adhere to the school code of conduct at all times. Inaburra has a strong relationship with local organisations and significant risk assessments have been maintained and refined over a number of years. Students will be briefed on particular aspects of safety in preparation for the program.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS AND TEACHER/STUDENT RATIOS

This program has a target maximum of 25 students due to a number of external factors. There will be an approximate teacher/student ratio of 1:7.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is in dormitory style rooms at Mulberry Vale Cabins Broken Hill.

COST AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

The cost of the Broken Hill Global Education program is estimated to be \$2000. The final cost of the program is dependent on several variables including (but not limited to) student numbers and seasonal price variation. This amount will be communicated at a later date and will cover:

- All transport
- All accommodation
- All activities
- All food, except for lunch/snacks on the first day which students will bring with them.

NOTE: Students are encouraged to bring some spending money as opportunities for private purchases may arise.

Inaburra requires this program to be paid in instalments. Instalment amounts and due dates will be outlined in detail, along with other key information about the program, once itineraries and total costs are determined.
