SAMPLE PROGRAM

ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
Conservation Activities	Students will be: <ul style="list-style-type: none">· assisting in conservation activities at Mt Rowland, including fuel load reduction, weed eradication and regeneration of native flora.· visiting the Trowunna Wildlife Sanctuary to learn about conservation projects including Tasmania Devils.· going on the Bicheno Penguin Tour learning about the habitat and protection of Penguins in Tasmania.
Outdoor Activities	Students may have opportunity to experience outdoor activities including short hikes and kayaking tours.
Historical and Geographical sites	Students have opportunities to visit significant historical and geographical sites around the state including Cradle Mountain, Tiagarra Tasmanian Aboriginal Cultural Centre, Wineglass Bay, Port Arthur, Kunanyi/Mount Wellington and the Female Factory in Hobart.
Community Service	Students will visit Emmanuel Christian School near Hobart, leading an activities day and sport afternoon, as well as sharing lunch and learning with their Year 10 students.

TRAVEL

Airline for travel ex-Sydney is either Jetstar or Virgin Australia. Travel within Tasmania will be by chartered coach and hire vehicle.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

Students will be supervised by Inaburra staff. Students will be expected to adhere to the School Code Of Conduct at all times and will be briefed on particular aspects of safety in preparation for the program and will also have an orientation session upon arrival in Tasmania.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS AND TEACHER/STUDENT RATIOS

This program has a target maximum of 25 students due to a number of external factors. There will be an approximate teacher/student ratio of 1:7.

ACCOMMODATION

Students will stay in bunk/dormitory accommodation with shared bathroom facilities at Gowrie Park Wilderness Village, CYC Blue Lagoon at Dodges Ferry. Cabin accommodation at Bicheno/Coles Bay.

COST AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

The cost of the Tasmania Global Education program is estimated to be \$2500. The final cost of the program is dependent on several variables including (but not limited to) student numbers and seasonal price variation. This amount will be communicated at a later date and will cover:

- All transport – flights and transfers
- All accommodation
- All meals
- Park entry fees
- Conservation activities and equipment (excluding clothing)

NOTE: Students are encouraged to bring some spending money as opportunities for private purchases may arise.

It would also be expected that students take appropriate clothing for outdoor work (for example, gardening gloves, sturdy footwear, and appropriate sun protection). Inaburra requires this program to be paid in instalments. Instalment amounts and due dates will be outlined in detail, along with other key information about the program, once itineraries and total costs are determined.

Please be aware that due to the nature of travel and accommodation, payment deadlines for this program will be very tight and must be adhered to strictly.
